In most schools, the word summer is synonymous with vacation. Research shows that students lose, on average, two to three months of reading and math skills over the summer. In the City of Rochester, since summer began, violence has spiked resulting in four deaths. In education, in Rochester, summer break can be seen as a detriment to student growth.

At Vertus, we view summer as a time of possibility. Our young men are in school all year round and we use summer as a time to present them with a variety of opportunities. They have the chance to work on lagging academic skills by working with SUNY Brockport graduate students, through a partnership that focuses on literacy. They have the chance to build new skills by

working in the Re-ENABLE lab building prosthetic hands and being paid for their work. They can take elective classes that interest them such as African American History, Boat Building, Anime and Graphic Novels, Photography, and many more. They learn real life skills, planting, weeding, and taking care of our newly built school vegetable garden. They give back to the community through various service projects with the House of Mercy and the American Red Cross. Summer does not interrupt their progress; it does not act as a roadblock to their goals.

We at Vertus do everything we can to provide our young men with a path to college or career, whichever they choose. Unlike other educators, we commit to working for and with our students year round and are thankful for the opportunity to do so. As we move through the summer months, we invite you to stop in and see the good work that is going on.

June Regents Exams

In June Vertus administered a total of 243 Regents Exams with an overall pass rate of almost 70%! We saw significant growth in Global History, ELA, Algebra I, and Geometry; Physics, Algebra II, and US History had a pass rate above 90%, with over 70 students tested.



in SPORTS



Vertus High School will field a Varsity Soccer team along with a Varsity Cross Country team in the fall of 2019. The Vertus Soccer program will be in their 4th season of varsity play in Section Head coach Scott Rogerson is in his 2nd year as the warriors coach. He will be assisted by Oli-V. va Schojan. The Vertus Cross Country program will be in their 2nd season of varsity competition in Section V. Head Coach Kyle Abron looks to build on what Coach Aubrey Sheffield started in the fall of 2018.

Student athletes who wish to participate in any athletic programs at Vertus High School are expected to get re-qualified with the school nurse prior to each sports season they participate in. To get re-qualified students need:

- An updated physical exam (within 1 year) on file
- Current immunizations on file
- Medical eligibility form signed by a parent
- Doctor orders for inhaler, epi-pen, and/or restriction clearance (if applicable)
- Glasses for vision test (if applicable)

Forms for sports qualifications can be obtained from the Athletic Director, Physical Education Teachers, and/or the School Nurse.

The "Role Models" have been educators, attorneys, business owners, engineers, etc., who volunteer to spend the evening sharing their life experiences and conversing with the young men about their own dreams and aspirations in hopes of making lasting connections which may turn into an educational, internship or job opportunity.

The Distinguished Gentleman event is successful largely because of the continued support received from the local chapters of international frater-



nities, community agencies, residents and various schools and colleges in our area.

Young men also have the opportunity to interact with members from the local chapters of internation-

al fraternities, local colleges and representatives from the City of Rochester.
