Vertus Charter School has a mastery-based system in which each student moves at his own pace. We divide our online courses into four sections, each worth .25 credit. As in all other schools in New York, the requirements to graduate high school are to earn 22 credits and pass 5 Regents exams.

We are working with each student to make sure he knows what credits he has and what he still needs to complete. If our students come to school and work every day, there is plenty of time in our school year to accomplish this in four years. Having good attendance and working productively in the Learning Labs leads to success at Vertus.


