We have reached the end of our first quarter—holiday vacation is almost here! As progress reports go home to families, this is a good time to review some of the details of how our students earn credits at Vertus.

Vertus Charter School has a mastery-based system in which each student moves at his own pace. We divide our online courses into four sections, each worth .25 credit. As in all other schools in New York, the requirements to graduate high school are to earn **22 credits** and pass **5 Regents exams**.

We are working with each student to make sure he knows what credits he has and what he still needs to complete. If our students come to school and work every day, there is plenty of time in our school year to accomplish this in four years. Having good attendance and working productively in the Learning Labs leads to success at Vertus.

Vertus Students Honored at First Annual Vertus Blazer Ceremony

At the conclusion of the ceremony, our young men received their blazers and proudly crossed the stage wearing a tangible symbol of belonging to the Vertus community.

The red Vertus blazer is worn on Fridays, on field trips, and at other special events throughout the year. To earn the blazer, students had to average 85% attendance for at least one month, memorize the Vertus creed, and demonstrate the ability to greet a visitor "Vertus style" (with a firm handshake and a mature introduction).

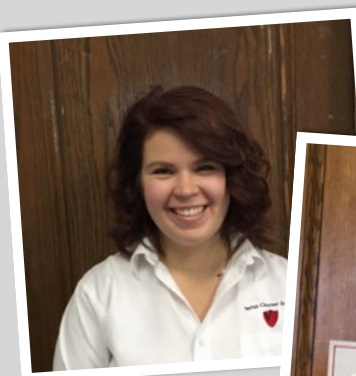
Vertus Welcomes Two New Staff Members to the Office and Learning Labs

Wegmans Executive Shares Tips for Workplace Success

Karen Wegman, Hillside Work Scholarship Coordinator for Wegmans, has been helping young people to succeed in their first jobs for 13 years! She describes her work as “helping prepare students for jobs, helping students be successful once they obtain the jobs, and helping them achieve success beyond graduation from high school. We [at Wegmans] love the energy and the excitement that teenagers can bring into our environment—it’s great for us and it’s great for our customers.” Vertus student Savon Scott now works at Wegmans and, with Ms. Wegman’s help, we hope to support other Vertus students working there in the near future.

When asked for tips on how to ace a job interview, Ms. Wegman shared the following:

“You want to make sure you’re familiar with the job you’re applying for—watch somebody do that job and make sure you understand what the job is going to be so there are no surprises. Also be work-ready; make sure you have all your proper documents and dress professionally for the interview. Be ready to answer the questions and know why you want to work there. And then be ready for the commitment—a job is a big obligation.”

Other important things to keep in mind for success at work: “Know that you have to be prepared for the unexpected—at Wegmans our schedules change all the time—and wear comfortable shoes! Standing up for 8 hours a day is no joke.”

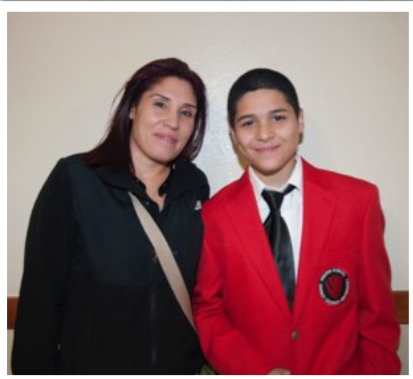
