

## Vertus Charter School prepares leaders of character.

Board Meeting Minutes February 26, 2018 Vertus Charter School 21 Humboldt St.

Bryan Hickman called the meeting to order at 5:06 pm.

Upon a motion by Stephen Jacobs, seconded by Linda Clark, the board unanimously resolved to approve the minutes for the January 22nd meeting.

Julie Locey presented the CEO Month-at-a-Glance Report, including a discussion about student attendance and solutions to busing issues that were contributing to poor attendance this winter. Julie presented an overview of Regents Exam results for the January administration, displaying various data points to demonstrate a highly successful test session, including comparisons to other charters and district schools, as well as pass rates by Exam, Preceptor teams, and House. A discussion about how to boost our lower exam scores (ie. Earth Science) ensued, as well as the different types of diplomas available to special education students (Safety Net options), and how they are earned.

Julie Locey transitioned the conversation to a discussion of the projected graduation rate for Vertus' seniors, showing a better than 75% expected graduation rate based on our measurements (transfer student adjusted rate); just under 65% based on the state's calculations which start with the first time a student entered 9<sup>th</sup> grade.

Dr. McGuigan led a discussion about our Board Statistics scorecard, highlighting the "On Track to Graduate" addition which demonstrates the percentage of 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year students who are expected to graduate in their 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> year.

Evan Gallina discussed our fundraising efforts, focusing on the upcoming 3 on 3 basketball tournament, which is shaping up to be quite successful. He also raised the issue of the Board's commitment to contributing \$10,000 as a fundraising goal, and how we could expand the board in hopes of creating a school that makes the top of the list for potential future donations.

Jason Trzeciak briefly discussed the January Financial Report, including a discussion about the cash being tight due to a delayed SPED Payment from the RCSD resulting in drawing down the Line of Credit to ensure payroll is covered.

Bryan Hickman moved to adjourn the meeting at 5:48 pm.
