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The Class of 2020 did not graduate in a ceremony that any of us had envisioned at the start of the school year, but the ceremony was amazing nonetheless. We live in a city where the graduation rate for brown and black males is one of the lowest in the state, yet were able to honor our family's sons, grandsons, nephews, and friends as they walked across the

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stage to receive their high school diplomas. These Vertus men worked hard to get to that point. They faced adversity and had to finish their year from home while missing many of the events associated with their final year of high school, but they persevered.

The Vertus High School model is different, so much so that we call it the #VertusDifference. Our blended academic program is innovative, but it is our focus on building strong relationships with students and their families that have a lasting impact. We teach our young

men to be their "Brothers Keeper," a phrase that the adults in the building model and that the Preceptors spend four years defining with their students. The Vertus Class of 2020 embodied this phrase. It is evident in their support of each other, in the words of encouragement they share, the way they celebrate each other's victories, and even in their drilling. We wanted so badly for them all to graduate together, but COVID-19 would not allow it. We take comfort in the fact that while they started this journey together and ended it apart, they will forever be Vertus Brothers at heart.



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### a message from the PRINCIPAL



School is back in session and it is so wonderful to have our young men back in the building. Our children and staff's safety is our first priority and we have worked diligently to ensure that there are processes and procedures in place to make sure that is the case. Our reopening plan outlines, in detail, the steps we take daily to limit exposure and sanitize the building. Our academic focus for the 2020-2021 school year will be to address any learning loss because of COVID-19, while accelerating new learning. With our on-line platform, Edgenuity, our students were able to continue their core courses and their teacher led classes without pause. Even with this continuity, we acknowledge that many of our students engage more actively and have improved comprehension with the aid of teacher support.

Our students' social-emotional health and well-being are just as important as their academic progress. We believe that the strong relationships we develop with our students and families help us to meet the needs

of every student. While we still maintain these relationships remotely, we believe strongly that in-person contact and instruction are vital to helping our students achieve character and academic growth.

As such, we have re-opened with a hybrid model that allows for continued remote instruction while still having small groups of students in the building on designated days in a safe way. Whether students are in the building, or learning remotely, we are dedicated to working with them and their families to ensure academic and character growth. The 2020-21 school year may look different then years past, but our mission to "Prepare Leaders of Character," remains the same.

This ceremony is the first step whereby the new students of Vertus High School become part of our community, our newest brothers. In essence, it is a rite of passage to become a Vertus Man.

#### Virtual Family Conferences

One of the four pillars upon which Vertus was founded is Strong Relationships. As such, we make a promise to meet with each of our families at least three times a year. In year's past, we would host Family Conference Nights at our building, encouraging our families to come in and meet their student's Preceptor, teachers, and support staff. ## in ACADEMICS

#### **Blended Learning**

Vertus High School uses a Blended Learning model to provide the best education possible for our students. Blended Learning courses consist of both in-person and online learning, which allows students to work both individually and in small groups. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, our students attend in-person classes twice a week and work from home virtually three days a week. Teachers use our online learning platforms, Edgenuity and eDynamic Learning, to assign content specific lessons and activities that can be completed both at school and home. In addition, teachers offer office hours multiple times a week to help students both in-person and remotely. This semester we



offer Blended Learning courses in Math, ELA, and Art. Social Studies and Science courses are only offered online, but we have dedicated staff in both subject areas that have scheduled office hours each day.



#### **College and Career Preparation**

I think that Benjamin Franklin said it best, "By failing to prepare you are preparing to fail." At Vertus, we take this to heart. We believe that all students should have the opportunity to be successful, and that success demands preparation. Preparation comes in many different forms, shapes, sizes, and paths. We know that every student is different and success is not a one size fits all endeavor. Vertus students have the opportunity to explore their dreams be it college, career, or military.

Many high school students think that they have plenty of time to decide on their college or career path and to acquire the skills needed to be successful. This is not always true. At Vertus we believe our students need to start exploring their career interests and developing their job skills now!

College and Career Preparation provides opportunities for Vertus students to participate in a learning experience that combines classroom instruction, hands on learning and support from strong community partners. We work diligently to create paths for your students to succeed, in school and after their graduation.











## in the **COMMUNITY**

#### **Vertus Partnerships:**

At Vertus, in addition to getting our young men to graduate, our goal is to set them up for success after high school. Through our community partnerships, we are able to provide our students with opportunities that will best suit the trajectory of their lives.

#### **RCTV & 100.9FM WXIR**

Vertus students have the opportunity to host a live FM radio show (The Vertus Way: From Boys to Men) on 100.9 FM WXIR and a talk show on RCTV. For these programs, students serve as spokespersons representing the youth of Rochester and sharing perspectives on social issues. In 2019, our radio show even won a radio production award! Through these opportunities, students are able to acquire an elective credit.

#### **YVOV**

Youth Voice, One Vision: The Mayor's Youth Advisory Council (YVOV) is an active council of young people working together to make Rochester a better place to live, and is coordinated by the Bureau of Recreation. Our students are able to participate in their efforts to:

- Conduct on-going community outreach and assessments to identify youth priorities
- Advise the Mayor and other City officials on a regular basis on issues of importance to Rochester youth
- •Carry out youth led projects and initiative to impact community change

#### **Career Pathways to Public Safety Program**

This is a partnership with the City of Rochester meant to increase minority representation and local residency in uniformed divisions. In addition, this program increases the awareness of career opportunities within the public safety field.

#### **Food Donations**

In the Vertus creed recited every morning by staff and students it says that, "We are leaders in our community". What better way to demonstrate that than to not only talk the talk, but also walk the walk. In the midst of the pandemic, our school was able to meet the needs of our students as well as community members by allocating food and other resources to those who are in need. Throughout the course of the pandemic, our school consistently donated groceries and supplies to well over 100 families.
