- 3.0 Credits of LOTE (instead of 1.0)
 - At Vertus: Spanish 1, Spanish 2 and Spanish 3
 - Local Checkpoint B after completion of Spanish 3

- You will need to fill out Part 1 of the application form and bring in a copy of your child's most recent physical (done within the last year).

⁴ This provision does not apply to minors employed in resort hotels or restaurants in resort areas.

Create and Build Your Resume NOW!

- No matter what you do after Vertus, you are going to need to make a resume!
- A resume should include the following:
 - Basic contact information: Name, Phone #, Email, Address
 - Awards, honors and recognitions you received in High School
 - Clubs, sports, activities you participated in, inside and outside of school
 - Previous work experience, even informal work such as babysitting counts
 - Keep it on one page and make sure to proofread it
 - Keep constantly UPDATING IT!

Exam Information:

- The ACT (and SAT) are standardized tests many colleges require for admission
- Most students take the exam once their junior year and once their senior year
- Upcoming Exam Dates:
 - Saturday, April 17th, 2021→ Registration Deadline 3/12/2020
 - Vertus has become a test site and will host the exam at school that Saturday!
 - We encourage every 3rd year student to register and take the exam on 4/17/21. The school counselors will reach out to every student with registration details.

- Future Ready Program
 - After school program that provides academic tutoring and job readiness skills. Through partnerships, they help secure our students jobs at companies such as Wegmans, Dunkin, Best Western, Holiday Inn Express, Taco Bell, and KFC.
- Barbering & Construction Program
 - On site semester long program. Upon successful completion, students can secure a job in the given field.
- MCC Dual Enrollment Classes & Bryant and Stratton "JumpStart" Program
 - College level classes offered to students. Vertus students can earn transferable college credits (in various programs) for passing the class.
- RIT STEP
 - Hands on, STEM exploration program. Prepares students for careers in the science/technology/engineering/mathematics field.
