"We do not falter in the face of fear or obstacles." This quote from our creed has proven to be more accurate for the graduates of 2021.




From masks, social distancing, temperature checking, and remote learning, our graduates






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have endured all the obstacles that were thrown at them. Despite it not being an ideal situation, they have successfully reached the finish line.







For us here at Vetrus, summer means just more learning. After a short week off, we are back at it, in the building, four days a week. Our commitment to our students is year-round, as is our school. We use this time to allow students to continue their academic progress, take part in field trips that expose them to area colleges and job opportunities, and take electives that might not usually be available during the regular year. in ACADEMICS




The term "learning loss" has become a common phrase in education as the pandemic has continued across the country. However, addressing "learning loss" was a contributing factor in creating Vertus's year-round model. It is a feature of our program that makes Vertus unique. Participation in the year-round program is expected and keeps our students from experiencing the regular "learning loss" that many students go through while being home for the summer.



The summer session at Vertus is used to catch up students with their core courses and prevent "learning loss" and as an opportunity to develop new skills and explore their interests. Each summer, Vertus expands the number of elective opportunities offered. Exploring student interests or getting them curious about new topics are important incentives to come into school during the summer when many of their friends and siblings are at home.

This summer, Vertus is offering our most comprehensive range of electives. For those with athletic ambition, Football Vertus and Basketball Fundamentals are offered. It is especially exciting to offer football as Vertus prepares for our inaugural season in the fall. Ms. Mack is leading a Mural Arts elective which will conclude with the students completing a mural on the walls of the school as a final project. Spring Sports Recap - Outdoor Track & Field

The Vertus outdoor track & field team competed in five Private-Parchial/Rochester City Athletic Conference League track meets, the His & Her Invitational, and the Gates-Chili Spartans Invitational before qualifying for five sectionals events.



Our team was lead by seniors Isaiah Cotton-Aikens, Jadiel DeJesus, and Marcus Hogan. Senior Isaiah Cotton-Aikens qualified for Sectionals in the 200-meter dash, 400-meter dash, and 4x100 meter relay. Isaiah ended up placing 11th in the 200-meter dash and 6th in the 400-meter dash of the Section V sectionals meet. Isaiah holds the school record in the 100-meter dash, 200-meter dash, Sweedish Relay, and 4x100 relay. Rahmeir Westbrooks also qualified for Sectionals for the shot put event. Rahmeir holds the Vertus High School record for the shot put event. Charles Herring qualified for Sectionals as part of the 4x100 meter relay and long jump.





Vertus Scholars: One student per core subject chosen by the department; they exemplify grit in pursuit of academic excellence.








The Team of the Month - Chosen by school leaders based on attendance, academic progress, and contributions to school culture.


tus surrounding area by picking up trash around the parking lot and Humboldt St. That same night, we took the students
