Month at a Glance March 2022

Academics/Character/Career

- We have rescheduled our annual Blazer Ceremony for Saturday, March 26th at Noon. We, of course, re-extend the initial invitation that we shared with you and would love to see you there, if possible.
- Family Night, on March 3rd, was well attended with a 46% attendance rate for the evening. This is a 10-12% increase over our past family nights. Preceptors will continue to meet with those families that could not attend that evening, and we expect to have over 90% participation by the end of this week.
- The annual staff survey was administered, and results will be shared with the Board at our April meeting.
- In line with our organizational values, specifically "We are responsible for our knowledge and development," four of the leaders attended the National ESEA Conference. Between ourselves, we heard over 20 different sessions and discussed what we learned and how we could use that information to plan for the upcoming school year. Trips like this also validate the reality that there is no other school just like Vertus. We returned from the conference with reinforcement that we are doing great things and others could learn from us.

I met with their representatives on the 11th to review the proposed grant budget and answer any questions they had.
